The publication titled Pflugerville's project as Renewable Energy at Work – Pflugerville said, "This Renewable Energy at Work project includes a demonstration of renewable energy for the City of Pflugerville's Park and Recreation setting. The installation provides electricity to a new barn and lights one-half mile of hike and bike trail. The trail has a solar/wind system, located on a picnic shelter sub-station. The ban employs a Photovoltaic (PV) system and wind generation system. Photovoltaic cell converts sunlight directly into electricity."
